

How Does Justice & Associates Get Paid For Preparing The Application?

Justice & Associates provides several different payment arrangements based on your preferences.

Single-Engine or Truck Applications:

\$750 or 1.5% of grant award (\$250 initial processing fee)

Multi-Engine or Truck Applications:

\$500 per engine, or 1.5% of grant award (\$1,000 initial processing fee)

Resubmittal of a Previously Denied Application:

\$150 per engine, or 0.75% of grant award (\$500 application processing fee)

Retrofit Projects:

Quoted on a project-by-project basis

If you choose the per-engine schedule, payment is due upon application submittal and is payable whether a grant is awarded or not. If you choose the percentage of grant award schedule, the initial processing or application fee is due upon application submittal. The percentage of the grant award is payable when the Governing Board approves your grant award.

What is the Carl Moyer Program?

The Carl Moyer program provides incentive funds for the incremental cost of cleaner than required engines and equipment. Eligible projects include cleaner on-road trucks, off-road, marine, locomotive and stationary agricultural pump engines, forklifts, airport ground support equipment, auxiliary power units and retrofit devices known as Verified Diesel Emission Control Systems (VDECS).

What Are The Program's Air Quality Goals?

The Program's stated purpose is to achieve near-term reductions in emissions of Oxides of Nitrogen (NO_x), Particulate Matter (PM) and Reactive Organic Gas (ROG) which are necessary for California to meet its clean air commitments under the State Implementation Plan. Additionally, local air districts use these emission reductions to meet commitments in their transportation conformity plans, thus preventing the loss of Federal funding for local areas throughout California. Reductions of particulate matter, a component of diesel exhaust, are important because the California Air Resource Board has identified diesel PM as a toxic air contaminant.



How Much Funding is Available?

Statewide, up to \$140 million is available annually through the year 2015. This money is distributed through local air districts. The local air districts distribute the funds through requests for proposals which are evaluated based on projects that provide the most cost effective emissions reductions.



When Is The Next Opportunity To Apply For Funding?

This depends on where the equipment is operating. Some air districts accept applications year-round while others solicit projects once or twice each year. Throughout California there is currently funding available to:

- Replace old diesel engines with new, cleaner engines in existing equipment
- Retrofit existing diesel engines with emission control devices
- Purchase new vehicles or equipment with emissions below applicable state and federal standards
- Replace specific diesel equipment such as marine shore-side, agricultural and airport ground support equipment with zero-emissions electric equipment
- Purchase zero-emissions electric idling reduction equipment

What Other Project Types Are Eligible?

The following is a list of other eligible project types:

- Reducing HDV Idling Emissions: Including Auxiliary Power Units, Truck Stop Electrification, Direct-Fired Heaters and Thermal Storage Projects
- Transportation Refrigeration Unit Projects
- Off-Road Large Spark-Ignition Equipment
- Airport Ground Support Equipment
- Locomotive Projects
- Agricultural Sources
- Marine Projects (new vessels and retrofit projects)
